KEY DATES IN AGCW HISTORY

| 1922 | The Seattle Chapter of the Associated General Contractors of America is formed for all contractors (later changed to Seattle Northwest Chapter). |
| 1925 | The Northwest Construction Council is formed for specialty-contractor and associate members. |
| 1927 | Heavy industrial/highway contractors break away and form a separate organization not affiliated with AGC of America. |
| 1930 | The Mountain Pacific Chapter of the Associated General Contractors of America is formed for heavy/ highway contractors. |

- 1945 The Tacoma Chapter of the Associated General Contractors of America is formed for all contractors in Pierce & Thurston County areas.
- 1970 The Seattle Northwest and Mountain Pacific chapters purchase land on Lake Union and agree to build.
- 1973 The Seattle Northwest and Mountain Pacific chapters merge, forming the Seattle Chapter.
- **1980** The AGC Education Foundation is established.
- 1981 The Seattle Chapter opens a legislative office in Olympia.
- 1983 The Northwest Construction Council is dissolved. The Seattle Chapter opens to affiliate memberships.
- 1986 The Seattle and Tacoma chapters consolidate into AGC of Washington. The Tacoma facility continues as an AGCW district office.
- **1990** AGC of Washington opens its Northern District office in Bellingham.
- 1990 AGC of Washington establishes the AGC Safety Team® to promote safe work environments that meet and exceed industry standards.
- 1991 AGC Group Retro is established.
- **1993** AGC of Washington opens its Central District office in Yakima.
- **1997** AGC of Washington celebrates its 75th year of operation.
- **1998** Through Task Force 21, AGC of Washington develops new mission and vision statements.
- **1999** AGC of Washington adopts a new five-year strategic plan.
- **2004** AGC of Washington adopts a new five-year strategic plan.
- **2009** AGC of Washington adopts a new five-year strategic plan.
- 2010 AGC redefines its mission and vision statements; the AGC Education Foundation celebrates its thirty-year anniversary; the AGC of Washington Safety Team® celebrates twenty years of safety excellence, and the Southern District office relocates from Tacoma to Fife.


- 2016 Nancy Munro, of MidMountain Contractors, takes the reins as AGC of Washington's first female president. Previously, Munro served two years on the AGC of Washington board and two years on the AGC Education Foundation board.
- AGCW's Board of Trustees officially adds one Future Leaders Forum (FLF) representative to the Board.

 AGCW develops a new improved website and on-line database. The BuildWashington.com website is created to promote construction-industrycareer awareness, to help connect craft workers and employers, and to promote industry training opportunities and programs throughout Washington State. Emphasis during the year is heavily focused on workforce development and diversity.
- **2017** AGC of Washington develops its first workforce-development bill, which is approved and signed by the Governor on May 5.
- **2017** The Future Leadership Forum (FLF) rebrands and changes its name to Construction Leadership Council (CLC).
- AGC introduces a special one-year Introductory
 Membership dues rate to certified DBE/WMBE firms
 joining AGC of Washington. AGC of America
 celebrates its hundred-year anniversary.
- 2018 AGC launches the Culture of CARE Initiative to promote workplace diversity and inclusion as well as to deliver resources to help companies become more diverse at every level of their operations. 100 member companies and public agencies sign on to pledge their support of the Culture of CARE program. The program goes on to be officially adopted by AGC of America.
- 2018 AGC of Washington files unfair labor-practice charges against 17 building and construction unions with Region 19 of the National Labor-Relations Board, stemming from a community-workforce agreement (CWA) that unions negotiated with WSDOT as part of the bid specifications for the SR-520 Montlake-to-Lake Washington Interchange & Bridge Replacement project. AGC believes in fair and open competition in contracting; accordingly, the CWA is flawed because:
 - a third party has come between employers and their employees;
 - it is bad for taxpayers;
 - it harms minority and small contractors, and
 - it excludes half of AGC membership and their workers who do choose not to join a trade union.
- **2019** AGC upgrades its website and database systems and e-newsletter service.
- **2021** AGC adopts new five-year strategic plan, looking to next hundred years of service.
- **2022** AGC Group Retro members enjoy a record \$78.4-million in premium refunds.
- **2022** Dawn Stephens of Ferguson Construction takes reins as AGCW's second female president.
- **2022** AGC of Washington holds year-long celebration of its hundred-year anniversary.














The ten-story, 114,789 s.f Seattle AGC Building was constructed in 1971 on the southwest shores of Lake Union.
